





Wee Willie Winkie

Colour the clock neatly.








Now, Shalini has 5 toffees.

Addition using number line:

Let us solve this sum 3 + 2 = 5 using the number line.




Start with the first number 3. Count 2 steps forward, you get your answer 5.

Addition table:

$$0+1=1$$
 $1+1=2$ $2+1=3$ $3+1=4$ $4+1=5$ $5+1=6$ $6+1=7$ $7+1=8$ $8+1=9$ $9+1=10$ $10+1=11$ $11+1=12$ $0+2=12$ $1+2=3$ $2+2=4$ $3+2=5$ $4+2=6$ $5+2=7$ $6+2=8$ $7+2=9$ $8+2=10$ $9+2=11$ $10+2=12$ $11+2=13$ $0+3=3$ $1+3=4$ $2+3=5$ $3+3=6$ $4+3=7$ $5+3=8$ $6+3=9$ $7+3=10$ $8+3=11$ $9+4=13$ $10+4=14$ $11+4=15$ $11+4=15$




